

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Injuries

- Life-threatening: find an FSF volunteer as quickly as possible. If you cannot find one, call 18 (fire department) while simultaneously contacting FSF management.
- Not life-threatening, severe injury: find an FSF volunteer as quickly as possible. FSF management will contact 15 (emergency medical services).
- Minor injury:
 - First aid kit available at the medical center. Please do not move it — treat the injury on site and put the equipment back inside afterward.
 - If that is not enough, go to the hospital by your own means. Notify FSF management of the situation.

For example, a sprain or a superficial burn is not a severe injury: it counts as a minor injury, to be treated first with the first aid kit, then at the hospital by your own means if on-site care is not enough.

Medical center

From Thursday the 27th to Saturday the 29th, daytime only: first-aiders will be at the medical center or on the dynamic events tracks.

Otherwise, refer to the Injuries section.

Emergency lockdown protocol

An emergency lockdown protocol can only be declared by FSF Management. The first alert will be issued through the Announcements channel on the teams' community platform (make sure you are on it). The reason will be specified in the emergency message. FSF staff members and on-site security will patrol the site to announce it.

In the event of an emergency protocol, follow these instructions:

- Secure the campsite:

- If strong winds: fold up the tents, and lay flat anything that can be, so equipment does not blow away.
- If heavy rain: make sure only water-resistant items are left on the ground.
- If lightning: unplug all electrical and electronic devices.
- Head to the pit buildings and stay there until further notice.
- Team leaders must count their team members and report any missing team mates to FSF management. Do not go looking for them — stay in the building, where it is safe.
- Do not clutter the conversations with secondary questions or requests before the emergency is over (i.e. anything not related to the emergency situation is secondary. E.g.: scrutineering slots, camping equipment to replace, etc.).
- FSF staff members will be at every pit entrance and exit to monitor the situation and assist in case of illness.
- Trips to the restrooms on foot will be allowed if conditions permit (acceptable winds), accompanied (min. 2 people), and regulated by FSF staff.
- FSF staff will organize rounds to bring water to the water fountains.
- No festive activity will be tolerated during the emergency: no loud music (speaker no larger than a 1 L bottle), no alcohol, etc. Pit lights must be switched on.

Failure to comply with the safety rules stated above may result in penalty points (min. 100 points), or even exclusion from the competition.

Only FSF management can lift the alert, through an explicit message.

Campsite evacuation

If the campsite needs to be evacuated for an entire night due to weather conditions, participants will be able to sleep in the buildings set up for this purpose.

/ ! THIS IS AN EXCEPTIONAL ARRANGEMENT and not an option: under normal weather conditions, no participant will be allowed in the buildings.

A map showing where teams should set up will be published on the website, as well as displayed at reception, at the medical center, and shared on the announcement channels. The buildings are made available for sleeping only: there is not enough space to set up anything else. In particular, no social area will be allowed.

Bring only what is necessary: sleeping bag and blanket, sleeping mat or mattress, phone and personal medication.

Report to FSF management anyone with reduced mobility or requiring special assistance.

Reminders

No alcohol in the pits: no can, bottle, keg, or cup containing alcohol is allowed in the pits.

Immediate exclusion with no possible appeal will be applied.

Any driving under the influence of alcohol will result in immediate exclusion.

A 3-meter-wide passageway must be kept clear on every campsite lane, to leave the space needed for emergency vehicles and for sanitary service provider.

Our night security agents do not speak English well; plan for a translator in case you need to communicate with them.

Vehicles parked at the campsite must remain stationary all week. Otherwise, they must be in the team parking lot. No car may drive through the parking lot, except on arrival (1st day) and on departure (last day).

No barbecue, gas stove, or open flame is allowed outside the areas designated for this purpose.

Do not move the barriers. Do not create a new entrance — there is only 1 access point per campsite. Emergency exits may only be opened in case of emergency.
